


RING WITH KNOB

MediCare Colgate Pessary sizes

MediCare Colgate pessaries should be prescribed and fitted by a medical professional.

At Medicare Colgate we understand the challenges associated with identifying the optimal pessary fit, recognising that this process often involves a degree of trial and error. While our extensive pessary range is designed to accommodate a spectrum of pelvic organ prolapse grades, we have developed a guide to assist medical professionals in the selection of the most suitable pessary type. We have included alignment to other manufacturers' sizes to support decision-making. See the size conversation column on product descriptions.

The pessary is the right fit if:

- It does not feel uncomfortable.
- The patient can bear down, and it does not fall out.
- The patient has no difficulty going to the bathroom.

Contraindications for the use of Medicare Colgate Pessary

The pessary should not be inserted if the patient presents with acute genital tract infections, pelvic infections, or if the patient is noncompliant.

Cleaning MediCare Colgate Pessaries

Before insertion of a pessary, it is important to clean thoroughly the outer surface. It is recommended to wash the pessary with nonallergenic, antibacterial soap & rinse with water, and dry before initial use. There is no requirement to sterilise before use. MediCare Colgate pessaries are not suitable to be autoclaved and are designed for single-patient use.

Fitting procedure

All Medicare Colgate pessaries are a Class IIa medical device.

Fitting requires a trial of various sizes to determine the correct pessary size. A vaginal lubricant may be required for the patient's comfort before insertion of the pessary. The medical professional should determine if the patient requires oestrogen therapy before prescribing a pessarv.

- 1. A medical professional should perform a normal pelvic examination before the fitting of a pessary. A pelvic examination helps determine the appropriate size that is required. The pessary will easily fold across the largest drainage holes to help with insertion and removal. The pessary should be large enough for its indication, but not cause unnecessary pressure or discomfort.
- 2. A medical professional should lubricate only the entering end of the pessary, compress, and gently insert through the introitus. Once the pessary has passed the introitus, release the compressed pessary so that it expands to its normal shape.
- 3. A medical professional should gently move the pessary to the cervix to support the cystocele or rectocele and the uterus. Once in the correct position, the physician should be able to insert an examining finger between the outer edge of the pessary and the vaginal wall. This spacing will ensure the patient's comfort and reduce the risk of pressure necrosis.
- 4. Once in place, the pessary should not dislodge when standing, sitting, squatting, or bearing down. It should not be uncomfortable for the patient during any of these routine activities.
- 5. If the patient is to care for the pessary, please inform on its cleaning, insertion, and removal.
- 6. It is important to inform the patient to report any discomfort or difficulty in urinating or defecating immediately.

Removal, cleaning & suggested follow up:

- 1. To remove the pessary, carefully move the pessary forward towards the introitus. When the pessary is within reach, compress the pessary and carefully withdraw.
- 2. The pessary can be cleaned with mild soap and warm water. The usage life of the pessary is limited. Examine pessary for signs of
- 3. Discuss with the patient the importance of following instructions and the expected length of time for pessary usage.
- 4. Within 24 to 48 hours, ensure the patient is not allergic to the pessary. Examine the vagina and ask the patient if there has been any discomfort, irritation, pressure, sensitivity, or unusual vaginal discharge. Also, determine if there has been any improvement in personal symptoms.





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
